1. Arapahoe County Sheriffs 4th Quarter Report

Lieutenant Tami Twombly, Arapahoe County Sheriff's, provided a report on 4th Quarter activities in the Town of Bennett. Lt. Twombly reported that for the 4th Quarter there were nine (9) calls for service which included medical assistance, a traffic complaint and a report of loose animals.

There were a total of thirty-one (31) calls for service in 2017 compared to thirty-nine (39) calls for service in 2016.

2. Adams County Sheriffs 4th Quarter Report

Commander Karl Smalley introduced representatives from the Adams County Victim Services Unit, a presentation of information on the advocacy program, and how they assist by providing empowerment to individuals to make decisions during a difficult time.

Explanations are provided on the criminal justice system and the services available. While the I-70 Corridor does not have a dedicated representative at this time, the office responds to requests received from deputies responding to calls.

Commander Smalley reported the following:

- Approximately 1,000 street racers returned to the Bennett Marketplace-King Soopers parking lot on the evening of Friday, January 19, 2018 and inquired if there are additional measures that can be taken to assist our Deputy's with the issuance of summons.
- Truck parking on Bennett Marketplace will be allowed only in the event of a road closure, and drivers will also be directed to Palmer Avenue.
