New Home Inspection Process



Below is the approximate order of required inspections and milestones when building a new home in the Town of Bennett. Processes may vary slightly depending on the construction plans for the home and arrangements made with the Town of Bennett.

- 1. Temporary Electric Service (optional)
- 2. Caisson/Footing
- 3. Foundations Walls
- 4. Damp Proof/Drain
- 5. Foundation Insulation
- 6. Slab on Grade
- 7. UFER/Concrete-Encased Electrode
 - a. Inspections 2-7 are typically met through a signed Engineer letter provided to the Building Department and available onsite for inspectors.
 - b. A Foundation Location Survey is required by the building department before vertical construction.
- 8. Electrical Underground/Slab
- 9. Plumbing Underground Interior
- 10. Water Service
- 11. Sewer Service
- 12. Exterior Drywall/Fire Rating (required where buildings or overhangs are within 5' of the property line)
- 13. Exterior Wall/Roof Sheathing
- 14. Exterior Shear
 - a. Inspections 13 and 14 may be conducted at the same time.
- 15. Interior Shear
- 16. House Wrap/Windows/Flashing
- 17. Rough Plumbing
 - a. Gas line (Pressure at 10 PSI) is completed at the same time.
- 18. Rough Mechanical
 - a. Manual J, D, S must be on site, furnace should be installed.
 - b. Fireplace is completed at the same time, if applicable.
- 19. Rough Electrical
 - a. Electric Meter Release is completed at the same time.
- 20. Rough Framing
 - a. Rough Mechanical, Electrical, and Plumbing must be inspected before scheduling Rough Framing inspection.
- 21. Insulation
 - a. An energy audit must be provided to the building department before proceeding to Drywall inspection, if applicable.
- 22. Drywall Fastening/Moisture Board
 - a. All drywall and moisture board must be installed.
- 23. Final Plumbing
 - a. Water heater is completed at this time.
- 24. Final Mechanical
 - a. Energy testing documents must be submitted to the Building Department before CO will be issued.
- 25. Final Electrical
- 26. Final Building
