Management Summary

The Bennett Municipal Court received a total of 147 citations from May 1, 2023, to August 1, 2023. The next Bennett Municipal Court hearings are scheduled for August 23, 2023.

Projects Status & Milestones

Judge Shawn Day issued an order adopting revised fine schedules on May 26, 2023. On September 1, 2023, the revised fine schedules will go into effect. The revised adopted fine schedules now include the specific fine associated with Marketplace Drive. The subject was brought up by Adams County Deputies who were perplexed by the \$250 Marketplace Drive parking infraction price in comparison to all other parking citations. In an effort to change behavior and discourage illegal parking on Marketplace Drive, Town Administration raised the fee in 2017 from \$80 to \$250.

The updated fine schedules have been provided to the Adams County Sheriff's Office, Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office and Town Community Service Officers.

SUBJECT: Community Services Department Update

Management Summary

The Community Services Officers' schedules will continue to be the following until the school year begins: Officer Keith Buono will work Sunday 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm and Monday through Thursday 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Officer Sonya Zimmerman will work Tuesday through Thursday 10:00 am to 6:00 pm, Friday and Saturday 2:00 pm to 10:00 pm.

Staff completed several training sessions during the second quarter of this year.

- Officers Buono and Zimmerman completed Rabies Prevention Training offered by the Adams County Health Department.
- Officers Buono and Zimmerman completed the "Lions, Tigers, Speech and Religion" class that examined animal rights and religious practices that involve animals.
- Officer Buono completed Confined Space Entry Training

Projects Status & Milestones

In line with the Board's Vision Statement, being proactive and keeping Bennett clean is a priority for the division. The Business Windshield Survey was completed April 24th, 2023. Staff have followed up with the noted discrepancies and have achieved compliance from all but one business. The outstanding business is currently working with staff to mitigate the issues and is on a department issued completion schedule.

A total of 39 animals were removed from the Town during this quarter. 19 in April, 12 in May and 8 in June.

Since April 1, 2023, 13 REVIVE grant requests have been received, and 13 have been approved. Requests have been for house painting, xeriscaping of front yards, tree servicing, artificial turf, etc. All funds for 2023 have been exhausted as of June 30th. Craig White has provided a thank you letter that is attached for the Board's review.

Other Community Services projects included, CMV Data Collection of Kiowa-Bennett Road in April, partnering with Bennett High School for "Seniors Give Back Days" in May and participating in Clean Up Day in June.

As of June 30, 2023, there are 189 code cases closed, 72 cases currently under investigation totaling 261 cases opened since January 1, 2023.


