Background					

Proposition 123 was approved by Colorado's voters in November 2022, and allocated several hundred million dollars of already existing tax dollars for affordable housing. The monies will be managed by the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) and the Governor's Office of Economic Development and International Trade. Organizations, such as the Town of Bennett, are eligible to receive this funding if the Town elects to "opt-in" through DOLA.

"Opt-In" means committing to increase affordable housing in the Town by a total of 9% over the course of three years, from an established baseline of affordable housing currently here. Bennett's requirement would be 17 units by the end of 2026. (Units that have received a building permit are eligible to be counted, even if construction is not complete.) Affordable housing can be increased in a variety of different ways, including new construction, land banking for future development and down payment assistance.

The deadline to "opt-in" for the current three-year cycle is November 1, 2023. Opting in earlier creates access to funding earlier, which would afford the opportunity to apply for technical assistance for a Housing Needs Assessment at the beginning of the process.

The creation of a range of housing has been stated as a desire by the Town and affordable housing has been identified as a need from the Bennett School District. Funding from Proposition 123 can be used to meet these goals.

On July 14, 2023, at the Board of Trustees yearly retreat, Proposition 123 and whether to "opt-in" was raised and discussed by the Board members that were present at that time. The topic was informational in nature and no decision by the Board was made.

Staff Recommendation

Town Staff recommends the Board of Trustees "opt-in" to Proposition 123 to gain access to these affordable housing funds and technical assistance.

Proposition 123 Affordable Housing Programs

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The ABCs of Proposition 123

- Approved in 2022 by Colorado voters
- Supports state wide efforts to address affordable housing
- Uses existing tax revenue, up to \$300 million (doesn't raise new taxes)
- Local governments must voluntarily "opt-in" to qualify for the available funds, resources and programs
- The "affordable housing" definition is based on incomes and prices of homes for sale and rent

Opt-In Requirements and Responsibilities

- The increase will be net new units; new construction or conversion to affordable housing
- Baseline of available affordable housing and agree to increase number of affordable housing units by 9% in 3 years (17 Units for Bennett)
 - 84 housing units permitted first half of 2023
- If the 9% (17 Units) isn't met within 3 years, the Town would not be eligible for Proposition 123 funds for the following year (2027)

Affordable Housing for Bennett

- Housing Rental or Ownership should cost no more than 30% of monthly income
- Average Home Price Currently \$440,000 approx. \$2,400 monthly payment
 - A traditional mortgage requires a salary of \$98,400 to afford this price
- Average incomes for teachers and firefighters do not support homeownership in Bennett
 - Teachers starting salary \$46,000 can afford \$1,150 payment
 - Firefighter average \$55,573 can afford \$1,389 payment

Benefits of Opting-In

- Access to technical support, which would include a Housing Needs Assessment to identify housing gaps in Bennett
- Affordable housing has been identified as a critical need of the Bennett School District
- Proposition 123 provides significant funds for the acquisition and development of affordable housing
- Without opting-in Bennett cannot access the affordable housing funds for program development and providing affordable housing to residents

RESOLUTION 983-23

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE TOWN OF BENNETT'S COMMITMENT TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNDER PROPOSITION 123

WHEREAS, the enactment of Proposition 123 (the "Proposition"), approved by Colorado voters in November, 2022, created a Statewide Affordable Housing Fund (the "Fund") to be managed by the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) for the purpose of creating and supplying affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, local governments desiring to receive grants and funding from this Fund in the first cycle must, by November 1, 2023, make and file with DOLA a commitment specifying how it plans to increase the number of affordable housing units within its boundaries by three percent per year by December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, a decision by the Town to opt-in to the Fund requires a three-year commitment and requires the Town to comply with the requirements set forth in the Proposition in order to receive and maintain funding; and

WHEREAS, there is no penalty if the goal is not completely realized; and

WHEREAS, the Town anticipates that money from the Fund could be used by the Town to prepare a Housing Needs Assessment; and

WHEREAS, by this Resolution, the Board of Trustees desires to express its commitment to increase affordable housing under Proposition 123.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BENNETT, COLORADO:

Section 1: The Board of Trustees of the Town of Bennett expresses its commitment, under Proposition 123, to increase the number of affordable housing units within Town boundaries through new construction or conversion by seventeen (17) units on or before December 31, 2026.

Section 2: The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Town Manager or her designee to file the Town's commitment with the Department of Local Affairs in order to "opt in" to the Statewide Affordable Housing Fund

Section 3: The Board of Trustees of the Town of Bennett expresses its commitment to encourage partnerships with developers and non-profits to apply for funds from the Statewide Affordable Housing Fund.

Section 4: The Board of Trustees of the Town of Bennett anticipates seeking technical assistance for a housing needs assessment.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TOWN OF BENNETT, COLORADO AND SECTION 27 METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("First Amendment") is made and entered into as of this 22nd day of August, 2023, by and between the TOWN OF BENNETT, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado (the "Town"), and SECTION 27 METROPOLITAN DISTRICT, a quasi-municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Colorado (the "District"). The Town and District are each a "Party" and collectively referred to as the "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District is a special district organized pursuant to the Special District Act, Section 32-1-101, et seq., C.R.S., and is located wholly within the boundaries of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Board of Trustees approved a Service Plan for Section 27 Metropolitan District (the "Service Plan") on August 28, 2018 via Resolution No. 722-18; and

WHEREAS, the Town and the District subsequently entered into that certain Intergovernmental Agreement between the Town of Bennett, Colorado and Section 27 Metropolitan District, regarding the Service Plan (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Town approved a First Amendment to Service Plan on August 22, 2023 ("Service Plan Amendment");

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to amend the Agreement to align with the Service Plan Amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Service Plan Amendment clarifies the intent of the Service Plan to provide the authorization of the District to create the Alley Subdistrict, as defined in the Service Plan, as a means by which operations and maintenance for the alleyways may be provided in the event that the District were to own, operate, and maintain the alleyways but not to require the formation of the Alley Subdistrict in the event the District does not own, operate, and maintain the alleyways or deems the ownership, operation, and maintenance of the alleyways unnecessary

WHEREAS, pursuant Section G. of the Agreement, the Agreement may be amended, modified, changed, or terminated in whole or in part only by written agreement duly authorized and executed by the Parties to the Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and mutual agreements herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS

1. <u>Subdistrict Authorization and Limitation</u>. The first sentence of Paragraph C. of the Agreement is hereby deleted and replaced in full with the following: "Pursuant to Section 32-1-1101, C.R.S., the District is authorized to and may create the Section 27 Metropolitan District Subdistrict consisting of the Alley Loading Units (the "Alley Subdistrict") to fund the District's and/or Alley Subdistrict's ownership, operation and/or maintenance of alleyways benefitting the Alley Loading Units."

2. <u>Notice</u>. The notice address for the District as provided in Paragraph L. of the Agreement is hereby deleted and replaced in full with the following:

3. <u>Full Force and Effect</u>. Except as expressly modified by this First Amendment, all other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

RESOLUTION NO. 982-23

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BENNETT APPROVING THE FIRST AMENDMENT TO SERVICE PLAN FOR SECTION 27 METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Town of Bennett (the "Town"), pursuant to Title 32, Article 1, of the Colorado Revised Statutes (the "Special District Act"), and Chapter 16, Article 5, Division 8 (Sections 16-5-805 *et seq.*) of the Town of Bennett Municipal Code (the "Special District Code"), has the authority to approve service plans for metropolitan districts that are organized within the Town's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, Section 27 Metropolitan District (the "District") is a special district organized pursuant to the Special District Act, Section 32-1-101, *et seq.*, C.R.S., and is located wholly within the boundaries of the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Town's Board of Trustees approved a Service Plan for Section 27 Metropolitan District (the "Service Plan") on August 28, 2018 via Resolution No. 722-18; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 32-1-207(1), C.R.S., the District shall conform so far as practicable to the approved Service Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 32-1-207(2)(a), C.R.S., "material modifications" of the Service Plan must be petitioned to and approved by the Town in substantially the same manner as is provided in the Special District Act for the approval of the original Service Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 32-1-207(2)(a), C.R.S., "material modifications" are changes of a "basic or essential nature," including but not limited to changes to the type and level of services provided by the District, a decrease in the District's financial ability to discharge debt, and a decrease in the District's service area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 32-1-207(2)(a), C.R.S., changes to the Service Plan "necessary only for the execution of the original Service Plan" do not require such approval; and

WHEREAS, Section V.A.1 of the Service Plan states that "[t]he District shall dedicate the Public Improvements to the Town or other appropriate jurisdiction or owners association in a manner consistent with the Approved Development Plan, the Intergovernmental Agreement, and other rules and regulations of the Town and applicable provisions of the Town Code"; and

WHEREAS, Section V.A.18 of the Service Plan requires the District to form the "Alley Subdistrict" for the operations and maintenance of alleyways benefitting the "Alley Loading Units" (as those terms are defined therein); and

WHEREAS, the Approved Development Plan, the Final Plat for Bennett Village approved on April 13, 2021 and recorded at reception number 2021000069814 on June 9, 2021 in the records of the Adams County Clerk and Recorder, identifies the alleyways as Tracts B, F, H, L, P, O, and Q and states that all tracts will be owned by the District or a Homeowners' Association; and

WHEREAS, Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Bennett Village recorded at reception number 2023000030986 on June 2, 2023 in the records of the Adams County Clerk and Recorder identify these alleyways as being among the "Common Areas" (as that term is defined therein) that are intended to be owned, operated and maintained by the Bennett Village Community Association, Inc.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Service Plan to provide the authorization of the District to create the Alley Subdistrict as a means by which operations and maintenance for the alleyways may be provided in the event that the District were to own, operate, and maintain the alleyways but not to require the formation of the Alley Subdistrict in the event the District does not own, operate, and maintain the alleyways or deems the ownership, operation, and maintenance of the alleyways unnecessary; and

WHEREAS, Section V.A.23 of the Service Plan provides that actions of the District which violate the terms of Section V.A. shall be deemed material departures from the Service Plan; and

WHEREAS, amending the mandated subdistrict provision of Section V.A.18 is not a material modification for purposes of Section 32-1-207(2)(a), C.R.S., as such amendment is not a change of a basic or essential nature; therefore, pursuant to Section 32-1-207(2)(a), petition to and approval by the Town for such amendment in substantially the same manner as is provided in the Special District Act for the approval of the original Service Plan is not required; and

WHEREAS, the Town finds that amending the mandated subdistrict provision in Section V.A.18 of the Service Plan is in the best interest of the residents, property owners, and taxpayers of the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BENNETT, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. <u>Section V.A.18</u>. The first sentence of Section V.A.18 of the Service Plan is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following: "Pursuant to Section 32-1-1101, C.R.S., the District is authorized to and *may* create the Section 27 Metropolitan District Subdistrict consisting of the Alley Loading Units (the "Alley Subdistrict") to fund the District's and/or Alley Subdistrict's ownership, operation and/or maintenance of alleyways benefitting the Alley Loading Units."

2. <u>Intergovernmental Agreement</u>. The Board hereby approves an amendment to that certain Intergovernmental Agreement between the Town and the District regarding the Service Plan (the "IGA") to delete the first sentence of Paragraph 3 of the IGA in its entirety and replace it with the following: "Pursuant to Section 32-1-1101, C.R.S., the District is authorized to and *may* create the Section 27 Metropolitan District Subdistrict consisting of the Alley Loading Units (the "Alley Subdistrict") to fund the District's and/or Alley Subdistrict's ownership, operation and/or maintenance of alleyways benefitting the Alley Loading Units."

3. <u>Effect of First Amendment</u>. Except as specifically amended as set forth in Section 1 herein, all other provisions of the Service Plan shall remain in full force and effect. Except as specifically amended as set forth in Section 2 herein, all other provisions of the IGA shall remain in full force and effect. To the extent there are any inconsistencies with this First Amendment and the Service Plan or the IGA, this First Amendment shall control.

4. <u>Compliance with Special District Act</u>. The Board finds that the amendments made herein do not constitute a material modification of the Service Plan for purposes of Section 32-1-207(a)(2), C.R.S., and therefore the amendments may be approved by this Resolution instead of in the same manner as is provided in the Special District Act for the approval of the original Service Plan.



Background

In 2019 and 2022, the Town of Bennett received an Adams County Open Space Grant to implement a recycled water system and deliver recycled water for irrigation use at Trupp Park as well as Civic Center Park. Town Staff has completed the Phase 1 Recycled Water Pipeline – Segment 1 as well as the Phase 2 Recycled Pipeline and is currently working on the startup of the purple pipe pump house and filter system.

The Segment 3 project includes the installation of approximately 2,201 feet of pipe for the recycled water distribution system, including appurtenances, a low point blow-off assembly, two (2) Air release/vacuum breaker valve vaults, ditch crossing and concrete encasement, a hydrant, two (2) connections to existing recycled water lines and other appurtenances indicated on the drawings and price form. The majority of the work is on Town-owned property and/or within existing easements and right-of-ways. Plans for this project were provided by MSK Consulting and W2 dated 7/6/23.

Summary of Bid

Company	Bid
Dan's Custom Construction, Inc.	\$400,400

Dan's Custom Construction, Inc. provided a responsive bid and is a qualified contractor with experience installing Segment 1, Segment 2 and the pump house and filter. They have also completed several projects with the Town of Bennett and have shown from previous projects how they provide competitive pricing with very little change orders due to the knowledge of the Town's soils, utilities and roads.

When reviewing the RFP, Town Staff did not request concrete repair or seed restoration. Staff estimates a cost of \$2,500 for any concrete replacement and \$25,000 for seed restoration to account for the area of construction that will occur. That amount has been added to the bid from Dan's Custom Construction, Inc. and will not exceed those amounts.

Staff Recommendation

Town Staff recommends the Board of Trustees authorize the Mayor and the Town of Bennett to approve a change order with Dan's Custom Construction, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$427,900 for the Phase 1 Recycled Water Pipeline - Segment 3 project.






