AGREEMENT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the TOWN OF BENNETT, a municipal corporation of the State of Colorado, (hereinafter referred to as "Bennett") and BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF ARAPAHOE, on behalf of the ARAPAHOE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE (hereafter referred to as the "County").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Section 30-11-410, C.R.S. as amended, authorizes the County to contract with a municipality for the purpose of providing law enforcement by the Sheriff within the boundaries of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Bennett is without monetary means to provide for the employment of any full-time law officers; and

WHEREAS, Bennett has requested that the County through the Arapahoe County Sheriff provide law enforcement services which the parties agree are contemplated in Section 30-11-410, C.R.S and

WHEREAS, the County, in the interest of health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Town of Bennett, deems it advisable to enter into this Agreement for Law Enforcement Services; and

WHEREAS, the County has determined to execute future agreements on a fiscal year basis.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The Arapahoe County Sheriff ("Sheriff") shall provide law enforcement as more specifically described herein and in Attachment A within the boundaries of Bennett within Arapahoe County commencing upon January 1, 2024.
- 2. The type of law enforcement services to be provided by the Sheriff, within the boundaries of Bennett situated in Arapahoe County, shall be similar to the law enforcement services provided in unincorporated areas of the County of Arapahoe and will include law enforcement communication center services, but shall not include enforcement of municipal ordinances. The Sheriff shall utilize, to the best of his ability and judgment, the manpower and equipment presently at his disposal in order to provide said law enforcement services. Offenders shall be cited into the District Court or the County Court of Arapahoe County as appropriate.
 - a. The law enforcement services provided under this Agreement shall not include non-routine law enforcement services associated with special events sponsored

by or approved by Bennett. For such events, it is expressly understood that Bennett shall consult with the Sheriff's staff regarding such event(s) and any law enforcement needs associated with the events that exceed routine service levels. Bennett shall negotiate a separate agreement with the Sheriff's Office for any temporary or off-duty services required for such events that exceed routine service levels. For purposes of this Agreement, "special events" and/or "non-routine service levels" shall mean events sponsored or approved by Bennett with an expected or actual attendance of more than five thousand people.

- 3. The term of the Agreement shall commence as of January 1, 2024 and shall end as of December 31, 2024.
- 4. For the law enforcement services provided under this Agreement, Bennett shall pay to the County the sum of \$50,295.26 for the term of this agreement, which includes dispatch services. Payment of said \$50,295.26 shall be made to the County in full upon execution of this Agreement by Bennett.
- 5. The services provided pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed by the deputies of the Arapahoe County Sheriff. The Sheriff's staff shall be responsible for maintaining all records relating to the services performed.
- 6. The County is, and shall at all times be deemed to be, an independent contractor. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating the relationship of employer or employee between Bennett and the County or any of the County's agents or employees. To the extent this Agreement creates a principal-agent relationship between the County and Bennett, such relationship confers on the County and its employees the authority to act on Bennett's behalf only as to matters covered by this Agreement. The County shall retain all authority for rendition of the services covered by this Agreement, including standards of performance, control of personnel (including discipline), and other matters incidental to the performance of the services by the County. Nothing in this Agreement shall make any employee of Bennett a County employee or any employee of the County a Bennett employee for any purpose, including, but not limited to, withholding of taxes, payment of benefits, worker's compensation, or any other rights or privileges accorded County or Bennett employees by virtue of their employment.
- 7. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver by either party of the protections afforded them pursuant to the Colorado Governmental Immunity Act, Sections 24-10-101, et seq., C.R.S. ("CGIA") as same may be amended from time to time. Specifically, neither party waives the monetary limitations or any other rights, immunities or protections afforded by the CGIA or otherwise available at law. If any waiver by Bennett results in a waiver of protections afforded to the County, Bennett shall, to the extent allowed by law, indemnify and hold harmless the County for such actions. If any waiver by the County results in a waiver of the protections afforded to Bennett, the County shall, to the extent allowed by law, indemnify and hold harmless Bennett for such

actions. Further, the County shall not be responsible for any claim against Bennett which arises out of services not performed by the County pursuant to this Agreement.

- 8. The County does not intend by the Agreement to assume any contractual obligations to anyone other than Bennett, and Bennett does not intend by the Agreement to assume any contractual obligation to anyone other than the County. The County and Bennett do not intend that there be any third-party beneficiary to this Agreement.
- 9. Any assignment, transfer or subcontracting of this Agreement is prohibited, unless written consent is obtained from the other party in writing.
- 10. This Agreement may not be modified, amended or otherwise altered unless mutually agreed upon in writing by the parties hereto.
- 11. Bennett is not responsible for Worker's Compensation claims to the Sheriff's employees working under this Agreement. The County shall procure and maintain Worker's Compensation insurance for such employees as required under Colorado law.
- 12. Bennett agrees to carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance with a minimum \$1,000,000.00 limit of liability. Arapahoe County and the Arapahoe County Sheriff will be named as additional insured under this policy. Bennett shall provide the County with a Certificate of Insurance reflecting that coverage. Arapahoe County agrees to maintain insurance, either through self-insurance or commercial policies, adequate to cover the liability and other risks to which it may be exposed as a result of the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- 13. Bennett further agrees to carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance, Public Official Liability insurance, and Workers Compensation for its own employees for the duration of the Agreement as well as for two years after the Sheriff's services terminate. Bennett shall provide the County with a certificate of insurance reflecting that coverage.
- 14. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without good cause shown upon 30 days written notice to the other party prior to termination. In the event of termination by the County, no damages liquidated or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of the County; however, the County will refund a pro-rated portion of the fee paid pursuant to paragraph 4 above.
- 15. Unless otherwise agreed in writing, this Agreement, and the interpretation thereof shall be governed by the laws of the State of Colorado.

This Agreement for Law Enforcement Services will be implemented by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office and shall not in any way affect the regular law enforcement services provided by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office to unincorporated portions of

Arapahoe County. The Sheriff will make all determinations in scheduling and designating the patrol area of the deputy supplied under this Agreement for Law Enforcement Services. The standards of performance, disciplining of deputies, control of personnel providing such services, and other matters incident to the performance of the services to be provided hereunder shall be in accordance with Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office policies and procedures.

All legal documents, i.e. subpoenas, summonses, or any legal paperwork not generated by the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office that require service shall be handled as follows: (1) Legal documents will be provided by Bennett to the Civil Section of the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office; (2) Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office personnel will serve only legal documents required to be served in Arapahoe County; (3) Bennett will pay for service in accordance with the Arapahoe County Sheriff's Office fee schedule, based upon the Colorado Revised Statutes.

Criminal and traffic enforcement action taken by deputies assigned to Bennett will be handled in the same manner and nature as enforcement actions within the unincorporated areas of Arapahoe County. Generally, it will be standard practice for deputies to utilize Bennett Municipal Ordinances for criminal and traffic charging whenever practical; however, appropriate charging shall remain at the deputies' discretion.

Law enforcement services provided to Bennett under this Agreement for Law Enforcement Services will be provided within the territory of Bennett that is located within Arapahoe County. Areas outside Arapahoe County, annexed by Bennett, will not be served under this Agreement for Law Enforcement Services. The Sheriff, or his designee, will meet with the Bennett Trustees on an as-needed basis. The meetings may occur in an effort to maintain communication and enhance community policing and partnerships.

RESOLUTION NO. 994-23

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH ARAPAHOE COUNTY FOR THE PROVISION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES

WHEREAS, C.R.S. Section 29-1-203 authorizes governments to contract with each other to provide any function or service lawfully authorized to each of the contracting units; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bennett and Arapahoe County are authorized to provide law enforcement services in their respective jurisdictions, and are authorized by C.R.S. Sections 29-1-203 and 30-11-410 to contract with one another respecting such services; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bennett wishes to contract for and Arapahoe County will provide law enforcement services to the Town of Bennett for 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that the proposed Intergovernmental Agreement for law enforcement services is in the best interests of the Town and its citizens and desires to enter into such Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of Arapahoe.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF BENNETT, COLORADO, AS FOLLOWS:

- <u>Section 1</u>. The proposed Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of Arapahoe for the provision of law enforcement services in 2024 is hereby approved in essentially the same form as the copy of such Intergovernmental Agreement accompanying this Resolution.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Intergovernmental Agreement, except that the Mayor is hereby further granted the authority to negotiate and approve such revisions to said Intergovernmental Agreement as the Mayor determines are necessary or desirable for the protection of the Town, so long as the essential terms and conditions of the Intergovernmental Agreement are not altered.
- Section 3. The Mayor and Town Staff are further authorized to do all things necessary on behalf of the Town to perform the obligations of the Town under the Intergovernmental Agreement and to execute and deliver any and all documents necessary to effect the terms and conditions of such Intergovernmental Agreement.

Final Budget Summary

The final Valuations from the County have not been received. Staff has adjusted the valuations based on information received from the County. Final valuations are due from the Counties by January 3, 2024. The Mill Levy Certifications will be presented for approval on January 9, 2024, at the Board meeting to meet the January 10, 2024, certification deadline. Additionally, Town Staff adjusted the Adams County Sheriff expense to reflect an increase of 6% as directed by the Board. No other changes have been made to the 2024 Budget or to the 2024 Directory of Fees presented on November 14.

SUBJECT: RFP 23-008 – Old PW Remodel (Safety Building) – Construction Contract

Background

The Town issued RFP 23-008 on August 20, 2023 to solicit qualified bids from qualified contractors to perform the remodel work for the Old Public Works shop (Safety Building), as designed by Allred Architects. This solicitation was open for roughly 4 weeks and bids were originally due on September 11, 2023. Prior to the final bid being due, the Town released several addendums. They were as follows:

- Addendum 001 Mandatory Pre-Bid Walk Attendee List
- Addendum 002 Contingency Requirement and Bond Clarifications
- Addendum 003 General Questions and Answers
- Addendum 004 Bid Date Change
- Addendum 005 Late Pre-Bid Questions and Answers

The Town had a very positive response to the RFP and had ten different contractors present at the Mandatory Pre-Bid Walk, along with the architects and engineers of record present to answer any on site questions. Prior to the bid, Staff received some communication from interested bidders that asked for a date change to allow them to complete their bids. Staff honored this request and the final bid date was pushed to September 19, 2023.

At time of bid, the town received three qualifying bids. Those bids break down as follows:

Contractor	Bid Amount	SF Pricing
Sage Design Build	\$1,220,774.00	\$447.01
Wilderness Construction	\$1,416,316.00	\$518.61
Builds By Design	\$1,296,866.00	\$474.87

Being that pricing came back so much higher than anticipated, Staff immediately stepped into a value engineering process with the lowest bidder and reached out to additional contractors to solicit bids from them as well. Through direct solicitation, Staff received one qualifying bid from KTK General Contracting, Ltd. Their number came in at a premium but not exceedingly high price point:

While this number was closer to the initial budget of \$600,000.00, it was still exorbitantly high. Upon receiving this initial bid, Staff went to KTK General Contracting, LTD. and immediately started working on value engineering items to pare this cost down even more. Staff also approached Sage Design Build

for a value engineering exercise but Sage never finalized any items for the Town, even though it was requested that they complete a thorough review of the numbers and finalize a lump sum value engineering price.

There was some discussion about the Capital Projects department acting as the general contractor for this project and directly contracting all parties needed to complete the remodel. While contracting directly would have been one money saving option, Staff was finding that competing against KTK's pricing was difficult. They're a very large contractor who builds myriad projects (locally and nationally) with QuikTrip, Dutch Brothers, Maverik, Chipotle, Chase Bank, King Soopers and multitude of other large companies. Their buying power is immense and their contractor base is very broad.

Through the value engineering process with KTK General Contracting, LTD., it was clear that they were capable and willing to assist the Town in making this process a good one and a couple of items were changed to help get the pricing to a more favorable place. Those include but are not limited to:

- Removal of storefront on east side of building, add Overhead Door (similar to Town Hall)
- Removal of awning on east side of building
- Removal of some cabinetry elevations in conference room
- Change to laminate top countertops in lieu of solid surface
- Opted for a more standard door and hardware package that still meets our needs
- Found an alternate lighting package

Though Staff was able to pare down the cost, the design intent of the project or the space itself wasn't lost. KTK General Contracting, LTD. provided a finalized value engineering pricing proposal to the Town, it is as follows:

To help fund the overage from the initial budget (\$600,000), the Town had considered going back to DOLA and asking them to assist with that. However, based on the email the Town received when floating the idea, we opted against doing so. That email is attached for your review.

To fund the overage from the DOLA grant, the Town will be using appropriated Capital Projects budget funds in the amount of \$311,000 from the CIP fund.

Staff has done some background work on KTK General Contracting, LTD. and reached out to their references and companies they work with. Reviews have been overwhelmingly positive. They're a very large builder with a host of both local and national contracts.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board of Trustees authorize the Mayor to execute a contract with KTK General Contracting, LTD with a not to exceed amount of \$911,116.00 with an effective date of January 1, 2024, for the construction and improvements of the Bennett Public Safety Building Remodel project.

As you're probably aware, we do have a supplemental request process; however, a couple of things to consider. Taking the lowest bid from KTK of \$1,015,776 and original budget of \$600,000. That would indicate that your shortfall is \$415,776. First, without taking it back to the EIAF Advisory Committee, DOLA EIAF can only supplement up to 50% of the original grant or \$150,000.

The field team reviews and makes recommendations to the executive director for the supplemental.

The challenge is going to be, at least according to your 2022 Audit, that the General Fund unassigned fund balance of ~\$4M represents 93% of the General Fund expenditures, which would suggest Bennett could afford the overage.
